A Brief Update from the Pastor

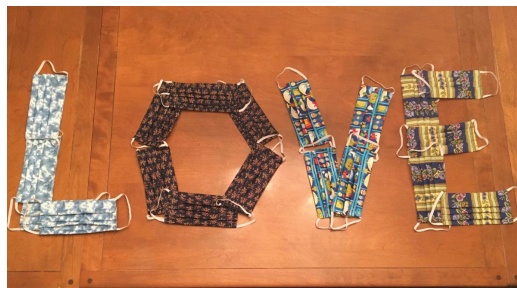
