With an eye on celebrating generosity, sharing good news, and keeping our church family informed about the results of our congregational giving, we will be sharing more frequent reports and updates on our stewardship of resources in this section in the coming months.

A Word on MPC's Helene Recovery Fund and the 2024 and 2025 Budgets

We have been blessed, in the difficult days after Helene and in the weeks and months since, by the care and compassion of people near and far. On Christmas Eve, the congregation of <u>Immanuel</u> <u>Presbyterian Church</u> in Schererville, Indiana took up a collection for Montreat Presbyterian Church's Helene Recovery Fund, knowing that our session is making real-time determinations in order to distribute that fund as efficiently and effectively as possible. We have gratefully received over \$800 from that church's generous contribution.

Immediately after Helene struck, the session made targeted grants to a number of local entities for specific purposes which were identified by those entities (MRA, Collins Center, Town of Montreat, BMCC). While that did have an impact on our 2024 budget, we knew that the human needs were significant and urgent, and that we had the financial resources available due to the accumulated year-in, year-out generosity of our congregation and faithful supporters.

We also recognized that our congregants have been generous in directly supporting ministries on the ground while also trying to meet their pledges—and all while dealing with their own traumas and challenges. The 2024 budget was already a "reach" budget, designed in the hope—justified by the giving trends of the preceding years—that an ambitious budget for outside mission could be approved and funded. All of these have been factors in 2024 having ended with a budget deficit, and the passage of a 2025 budget that is slightly higher than the total of the pledges we have received so far for this year.

At its stated meeting on January 21, the Session affirmed that the money we spent from reserves to assist our local community in its hour of dire need is not to be reimbursed by incoming contributions to MPC's Helene Recovery Fund, but those new receipts will be regarded as resources for additional giving. The session continues to follow the Mission Committee's recommendation that we target ministries that directly meet human needs in our area resulting from Helene's destruction.


