

Regular Updates on MPC's Financial Stewardship

God continues to lead us into the world! At its March meeting, the Session allocated additional targeted gifts from MPC's Helene Recovery Fund to three established partner ministries which meet the criteria that the Mission Committee recommended last Fall: they serve the affected areas near us; they meet urgent human needs; and they are specifically geared toward post-Helene relief.

The three recipients are **Bounty & Soul**, SVCM's **Neighborcare Clinic** program, and the **Black Mountain Counseling Center**.

Each is receiving a \$4000 gift from the Fund this month.

In this way, the Session felt that the generosity of donors to our Helene Recovery Fund could make tangible differences in making nutritious food, medical care, and trauma healing accessible for the vulnerable in our Helene-affected area. **Other targeted gifts** will be announced soon.

While contributions to the Helene Recovery Fund have begun to ease (a natural and expected part of the recovery cycle), MPC's session will continue to distribute support for community partners with a view to making gifts that offer maximum efficiency and impact for as long as these funds are available.

Meanwhile, our Mission Committee continues its ongoing, robustly faithful budget investment in ministry partners who are making an enormous difference, and members and friends of our church family continue to astound with what they give and do for the community and the world with inspired goodness and generosity.

HIV Testing Kits Urgently Needed for Honduras: How You Can Help

Among the challenges connected with the sudden pause of USAID is the devastating effect of HIV in Honduras, especially on children, and the imminent loss of their ability to provide for crucial HIV testing. (MdL was originally founded as a hospice for children with AIDS; their mission and ministry have grown to encompass many other areas of care.)

We can do something to help. Anyone can visit a website that offers two free HIV testing kits per person per quarter (click on the underlined link).

When Skeet and the team from MPC visit MdL in June, they will take as many HIV testing kits as they can. Skeet will have a basket at worship services where unopened HIV testing kits can be donated for this cause.
